# STRAWBERRY PRETZEL JELLO SALAD

### [PRINT](#)

This is one of the most requested recipes for potlucks and BBQs! Its sweet, salty and the perfect combo of textures!

Recipe type: Dessert

- 2 cups crushed pretzels (I used the checker shaped ones but you can also use sticks)
- ¾ cup butter, melted
- 3 Tbsp. sugar
- 16 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1½ cups sugar
- 16 oz. cool whip, thawed to room temperature
- 1 (6 oz) box Strawberry Jello
- 2 cups boiling water
- 3 cups strawberries, sliced

Combine melted butter and sugar. Stir in the crushed pretzels. Press evenly on the bottom of a 9x13 pan. Bake at 375 degrees F for 8 minutes. Let cool completely.

2. In a large bowl, combine cream cheese, sugar, and cool whip. Beat until smooth. Spread over pretzel crust. Make sure to get the cream mixture tight against the edges of the pan to prevent the jello mixture from seeping through.

3. Bring 2 cups of water to a boil. Remove from stove and add jello. Stir until Jello is dissolved. Add sliced strawberries. Pour over cream layer and put in the fridge for at least 4 hours.

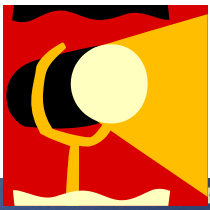
## Results of the Ladies Driving Test

## Scioto Spotlight – Doug Jones



"Our Member Spotlight for July is shining on Doug Jones. Doug and his wife Darlene have been married 47 years. Having joined the Scioto Model A Ford Club in 1978, Doug has served as the club's MARC Region Director for the past 7 years. Previous to his membership in our club, Doug was a member of the DC Model A Club for 10 years.

Doug and Darlene are the proud owners of 4 classics, including a '29 Model A Sport Coupe, a '29 Buick Sport Roadster, a '51 Chrysler Coupe and a '64 Studebaker Avanti. An automotive passion began for Doug when he purchased his first car, a '53 Studebaker. Be sure to ask Doug about the history behind acquiring his Model A. It's quite an interesting story, involving Darlene, her father and her father's Idaho neighbor.

Doug completed his Masters and Doctorate programs at OSU as well as serving in the United States Air Force for 9 years. His last 5 years in the military were spent as a faculty member at the Air Force Academy in the Department of Economics.

In 1965, Doug's public service career continued when he was appointed by President Johnson to a 3 year post in Alaska to analyze the rebuilding of the State following the earthquake of 1964. Further positions included working as Special Assistant to the Secretary of Commerce, a member of the Staff of one of the Alaskan Senators and working as the Assistant Director of the Economics Division of the Library of Congress. Doug was appointed a professor at OSU in the School of Public Policy and Management in 1978. Even though he retired in 2004, he continues to teach and mentor graduate students in OSU's John Glenn School of Public Affairs.

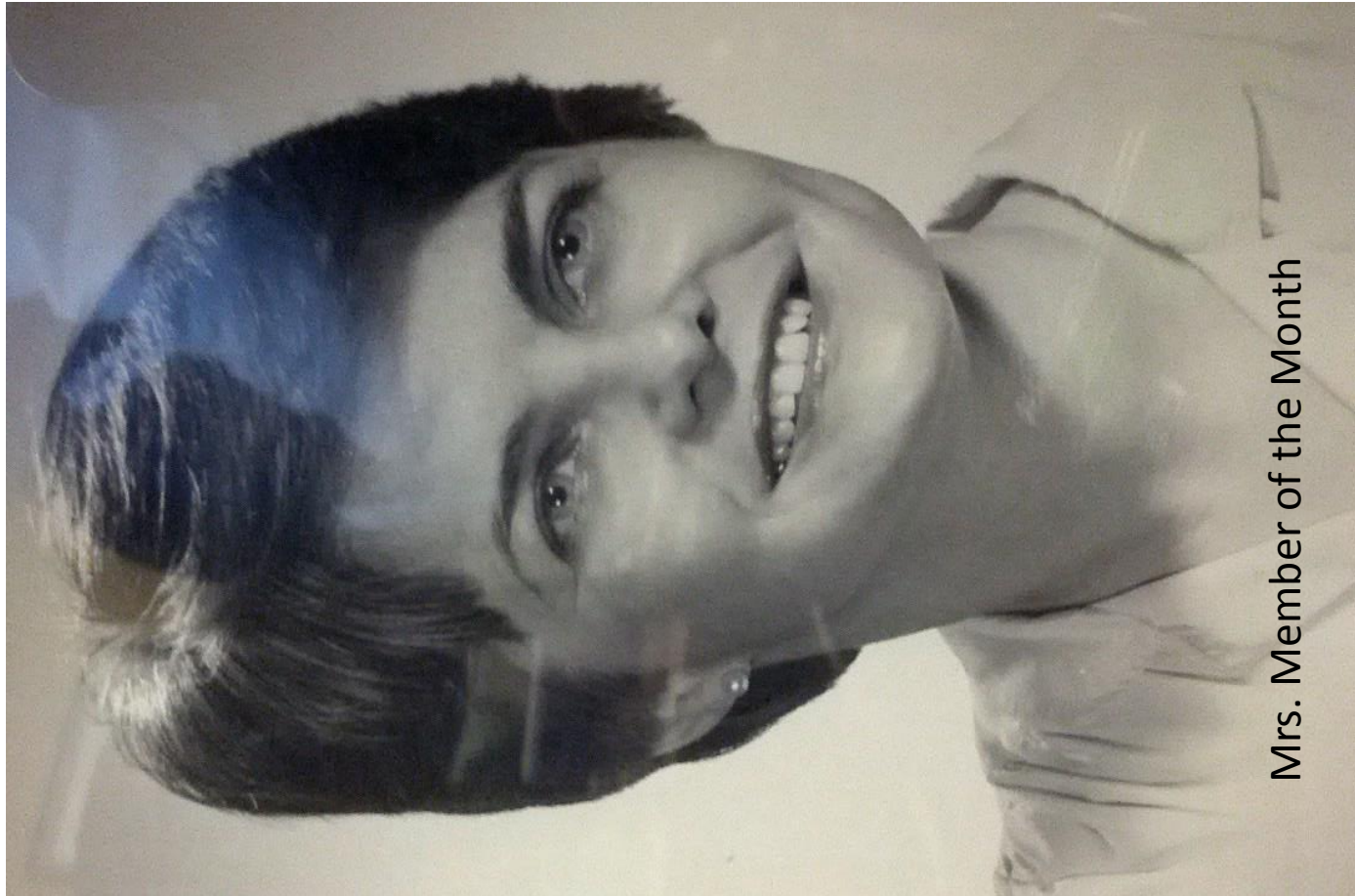
