Hello all

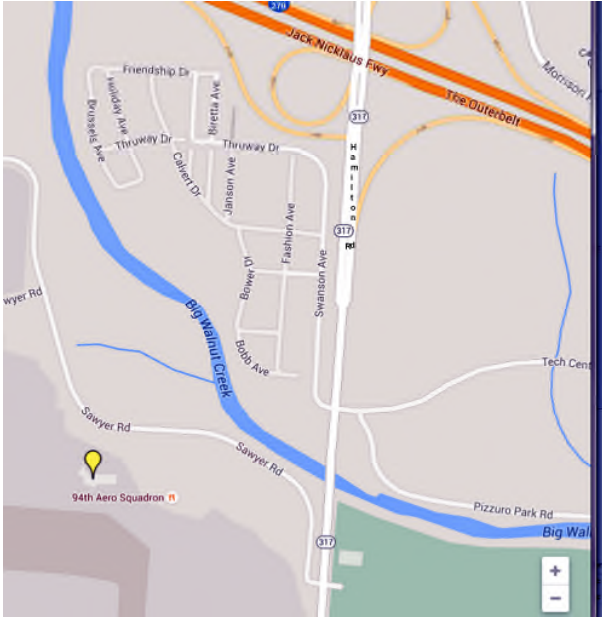

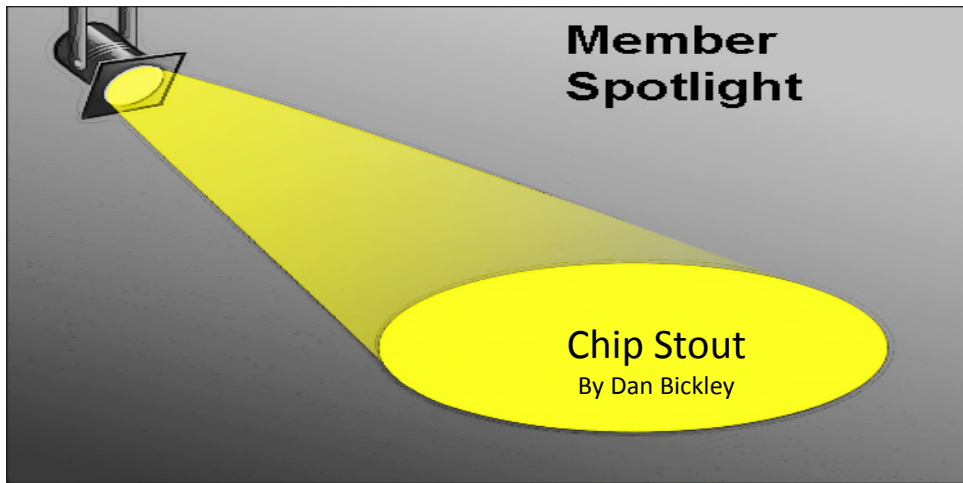

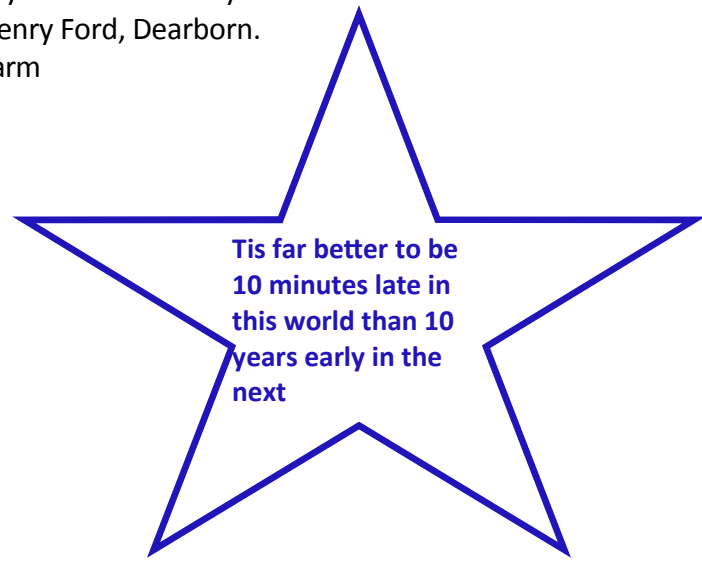

Helpful Hints from days of Yore.



Carbon deposits can be prevented by injecting a tablespoonful of kerosene in each cylinder once a week. This should be done while the engine is still warm and should be permitted to remain overnight. On starting the motor in the morning, the carbon will be blown out through the exhaust.

or

Remove the spark plugs and valve caps; **Inject** a small quantity of kerosene into the cylinder head and **ignite**. Pure oxygen under a pressure of about five pounds per square inch, supports the combustion of the kerosene; the carbon deposits ignite and continue burning until they have been consumed. **Don't try this at home.**

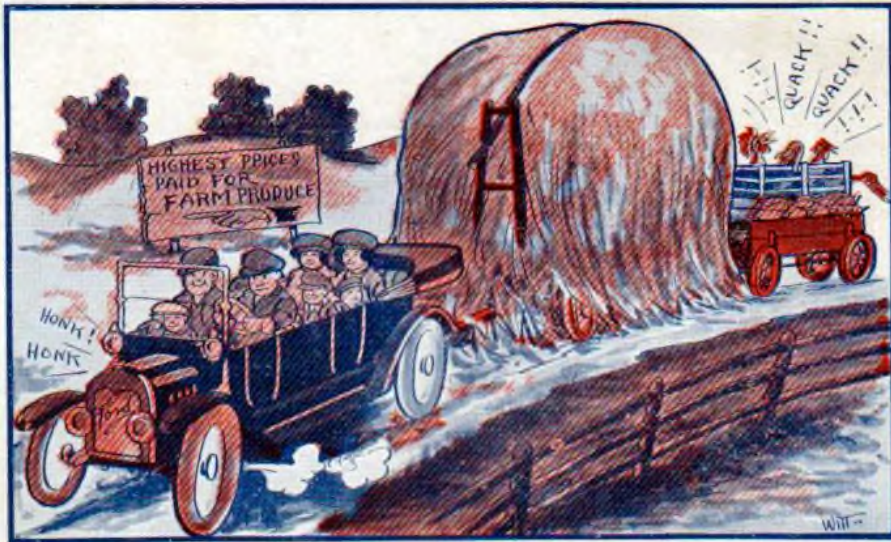
