








Clark and Kim Garn who have a 1931 Slant Window Fordor

Fun Stuff

Generator Failures:

The failure of a generator is usually caused by a dirty commutator or brushes not making contact.

In an emergency, the trouble may sometimes be remedied at least temporarily.

- 1. Run the engine and holding a small cloth-covered stick against the commutator. Enough foreign matter may be removed to enable the generator to function again.
- 2. For better results, a piece of sandpaper may be wrapped around the stick. Use only a fine grade (about 00) and race motor for an instant after the commutator has been cleaned, to blow out any foreign matter which may remain.




How far did you drive this year?

Ken Szakelyhidi has found a dealer for replacement LED tail lights which are much brighter. They are all red, available for 6 or 12 volt positive or negative ground. These are bayonet style bulb fittings which require no rewiring, and are \$45 +tax per light.
