

Parading in a Model "A" Ford By Rick Lindner

The Model "A" Ford has seen a lot of parades, and I hope to give some insight on new time "paraders". I am also assuming that your Model "A" is in proper running order, engine timed, and brakes operational. Check and top off the water, oil, and gasoline first.

The Clutch – if there is ever a part that gets abused during a parade, this is it. The Ford Model "A" has a very heavy flywheel which is quite capable of helping move the car forward from a stop – without a heavy throttle and high rpms. The latter will surely cause a burnt out clutch plate after this kind of abuse. Just a slight increase in rpms and a somewhat quick release of the clutch gets you on your way. Try it sometime – just have the Ford idle and let the clutch out (example for time - from completely on the floor to all the way up, say "one thousand and one", at which time you should not even have your foot on the clutch pedal). If the Ford dies, you may want to just pull the gas lever down one notch – but I really doubt you need to do that.

AND keep that foot **off** of the clutch!!!! The fewer times you push the pedal in, or out, the easier it is on the clutch – and your left knee. Judge your distance by using the gas lever or pedal. Another tip, when the parade is going downhill – put the Ford in neutral and coast, only using the foot brake to slow the momentum. If your Ford won't coast, you have brake issues.

Also, be sure you have enough **gas** in the tank and a spare jug of **water**. Parades can be tough for cooling and if you boil over – just pull off and let her steam. It won't hurt anything as long as there is water in the radiator enough to cover the cylinder head. Once she is cooled off, start her up, let her idle, and slowly – **repeat** – slowly fill the radiator. Then finish the parade, the crowd will cheer you on.

Another tip – don't just run the engine waiting to start. Parades are slow moving and you will have plenty of time to hit the starter and move out. REMEMBER – keep that spark lever **up** when starting!! The longer you run the engine, the greater the chance of other problems such as overheating. See how often you do **NOT** use the clutch pedal!!

Use common sense and enjoy the parade.




A Complete stop. It the Law! Not just a suggestion.


Should I have turned the brake adjustment wedge the other way?
