0.9 miles turn Rt. 79/Walnut road. (it is the first left)


0.6 miles Right on Millersport road.

Follow Bulaville Pike (CR 3) about 5 miles to the where road T's and turn LEFT staying on Bulaville Pike.


Mink Farm is on the Left about ¼ mile down the road.

Increased the treasury by \$299. And, we got to see the paramedic unit that some members have worked on.




John Glenn Home, National Road and Zane Grey Museum

GUIDE To Tools
