




More Tips from old time DIY books

How to test valves to assure they are tight.

You don't need to do much grinding to make a valve gas-tight, unless the valve is badly warped or pitted.

You can easily test the valve with this tester.

- 1. Fit a valve stem to the bottom of a tin can. (see picture)
- 2. Place a washer to make it air tight. This can be made from an old inner tube.
- 3. Place the washer under the edge of the can.
- 4. Slide a short section of rubber tubing over the end of the valve stem.
- 5. Wipe both the face and seat free from oil or grinding paste.
- 6. Test that the tester is air-tight by testing it on a flat metal surface.
- 7. Press the can tightly over the valve with the rubber washer under it.
- 8. Blow in the tube. If you can continue blowing, it proves that air is leaking past the valve and you need to grind it more,.
