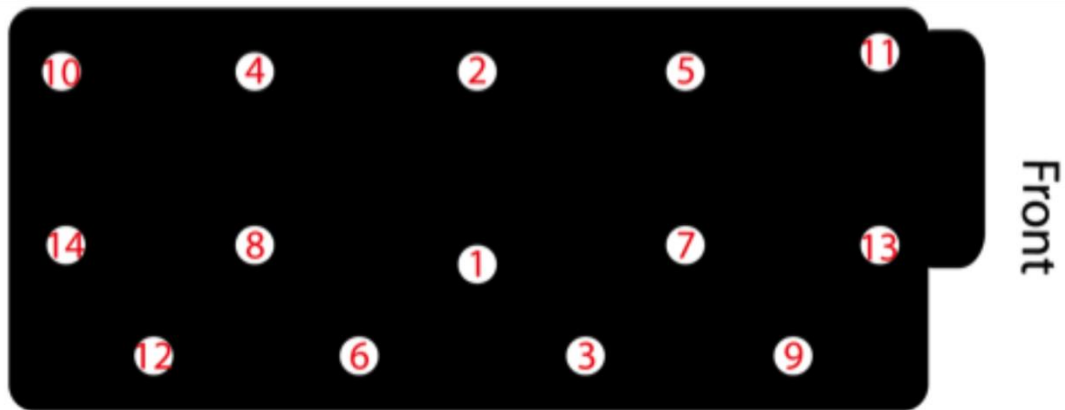

BACKYARD TECH TIP



When installing a cylinder head on a Ford Model "A", the cylinder head nuts should be tightened in a certain sequence. Pictured below is the cylinder head nut tightening sequence which is commonly recommended by various modern Model "A" publications.



Model A Ford Engine Head Torquing Pattern

Although Ford did not publish actual torque values for the Model "A" cylinder head nuts, the long accepted standard has been 55 lb.-ft. for a stock head and as much as 65 lb.-ft. for a 6:1 high compression head. It is recommended to initially torque the head in three passes following the sequence above, going from 35 to 45 to 55 lb.-ft. After some running and cool down cycles, it is recommended to re-torque the cylinder head nuts in the proper sequence one more time to 55 lb.-ft. because the gasket will take some compression and lose some torque after the initial use.
