

Scioto Model "A" Ford Club Member Receives Honor






Model "A" Tune-Up Days On April 13th the club held our annual West Side Tune-Up Day in





Brake Project

Back in late December I decided to go over my entire brake system on my 1930 Tudor. While doing so I decided it would be the perfect time to install the "Flathead Ted's Brake Kit" that I had been reading about. Not knowing exactly what I would be getting into or how much it would ultimately cost, I decided to do one wheel at a time. I started with the right front. I removed the drum, inspected everything, made a list of parts that I needed and placed an order. Once that wheel was totally done, I moved on to the next. I systematically moved from wheel to wheel until the entire job was completed. I was surprised throughout the process of the things I found. I stumbled onto a front bearing that was starting to go bad, a missing grease baffle, a stuck brake cam, two broken backing plates and a right hand emergency brake lever on the left side of the car! It turned out to be quite the project, but now I feel much better about traveling down the road this touring season.

BACKYARD TECH TIP



IS IT THE COIL?

Many times on a tour when there are several people trying to diagnose a car with no spark, someone will suggest that the coil may be bad. Here is how to test the coil.

Testing the Coil

- 1. Turn the ignition key off.
- 2. Remove the high tension wire from the center post on the coil.
- 3. Remove the black wire from the negative (-) terminal and the red wire from the positive (+) terminal.
- 4. Set an ohmmeter to the lowest scale and measure the resistance from the positive (+) to the negative (-) terminal.

This should measure 1.6 to 1.8 Ohms

5. Set the Ohm meter to the 10K scale. Measure the resistance from the positive (+) terminal to the center (high tension) contact. Then measure the resistance from the negative (-) terminal to the center (high tension) contact.

Both of these should measure 6.7K ohms to 10K ohms

6. Measure the resistance from the positive (+) terminal to the outer metal case of the coil. Then measure the resistance from the negative (-) terminal to the outer metal case of the coil.

Both of these should measure as an Open Circuit.

Corrective Action

If tests 4 and 5 show a short or open reading, it indicates a defective coil.

If test 5 shows any reading except an open circuit, the coil is defective and must be replaced.
