


BACKYARD TECH TIP



Hood Anti-Chip Protector

A very simple solution to the problem of chipping the paint on your hood when latching the hood down with the hood handles is to cut four one-inch or two-inch lengths of fuel tubing, which are then cut length wise as shown. Slide the tubing over the rolled lower edge of the hood and secure in place with a dab of silicone.



"A" Word on Fashion

The fashion industry underwent many changes during the thirties in response to the severe economic hardships of the time. Factory-made garments (what we now refer to as "ready-to-wear") became popular because clothing could be mass produced for far less than made-to-order custom garments. The insurgence of ready-to-wear fueled the buy at home catalog market. During this era, zippers became a staple in finishing a garment – they cost less than buttons! Less expensive fabrics, "rough" or "peasant" fabrics and cotton became more widely used. In fact, nubby, textured, crepe, or crinkled "rough" fabrics became a trend, "the rougher the smarter!" declared one catalog, particularly for day dresses, skirts and coats.

FLAPPER of the MONTH





This month we feature Canadian-born Marie Prevost, born Marie Bickford Dunn on November 8, 1896. Discovered by Mack Sennett in 1910, she appeared in dozens of short comedy films. In 1922 she signed with Warner Bros. After being let go by Warner Bros. and the death of her mother in 1926 along with the failure of her marriage in 1927, she suffered depression. She began to abuse alcohol and binge eat, resulting in weight gain that made it difficult for her to secure acting jobs. Her last onscreen appearance was in 1936. After years of drinking, Prevost died of acute alcoholism at the age of 40 in January 1937. Prevost's estate was valued at only \$300 since she had squandered most of her earnings.
