






Are Your Horn Wires Connected Correctly?

The <u>incorrect</u> way to attach your horn wires.



****A** Word on Fashion**

Afternoon and evening dress fashions were turned into 1930s wedding dresses. Informal light floral tea dresses with excessive ruffles and butterfly sleeves started off the 1930s. Next came the bias cut dress with a modest high neck, long sleeves and a floor length gown that had a fishtail train made of silk or shiny satin. They paired these with very long, lace trim veils cascading down the back to meet the church aisle. In the last few years, they took inspiration from the turn of the century using large mutton sleeves and a full skirt.

This month we feature American actress Anita Page (born Anita Evelyn Pomares in 1910). She was referred to as "the girl with the most beautiful face in Hollywood" in the 1920's. She reportedly received the most fan mail of anyone on the MGM lot. Her first film for MGM was the 1928 comedy-drama "Telling the World". When her contract expired in 1933, she surprised Hollywood by announcing her retirement at the age of 23. She made one more movie in 1936 and then left the screen, virtually disappearing from Hollywood circles for sixty years. In 2004, she claimed that her refusal to meet demands for sexual favors by MGM's head of production is what truly ended her career. She said that Mayer colluded with the other studio bosses to ban her and other uncooperative actresses from finding work. Page returned to the screen in 1996 after sixty years of retirement and appeared in several low budget horror films. Page died on September 6, 2008 at her Los Angeles home at the age of 98.
