


There will be <u>NO</u> Scioto Model "A" Ford Club meeting in January!

Hard Steering ???

If you feel that your Model "A" is steering harder than other Model "A"s, there are several things you can do to ease the problem.

- 1. Check your front end castor; too much castor (caused by sagging front spring) can cause difficult steering.
- 2. Improper steering adjustment; over-adjusting to remove play.
- 3. Worn front tires.
- 4. Low air pressure 35 psi minimum pressure is recommended.
- 5. Lack of steering lubrication.
- 6. Improper steering box lubricant.
- 7. Worn steering arm balls.

If all of the above have no effect, there is a product on the market to ease your steering. It is in kit form. It includes the replacement of the drag link and tie-rod ends with Teflon, and can be obtained through your Model "A" stores.

****A**** Word on Fashion

Men's suit lapels where not very wide during the 1920s, which was a trend that was started during World War I (1914 to 1918). This is also the era in which men began to wear cuffed trousers. Flannel also became increasingly popular, and so did twotoned white and tan or white and black shoes for casual wear. Some of the casual shoes that were worn by men were made with fringed tongues, and/or winged tips. The black patented leather shoes were still worn for more formal dress. However, the lace-up styled shoe was becoming more and more popular for men.

This month we feature actress Lillian Gish. Lillian was born in 1893 in Springfield, Ohio. Her family moved to New York, where she became good friends with next-door neighbor, Gladys Smith. Gladys was a child actress who did some work for director D. W. Griffith. In 1912, Gladys introduced Lillian to Griffith and helped her get a contract with Biograph Studios. Lillian would soon become one of America's best-loved actresses. Gish was called "*The First Lady of American Cinema*". In 1925, MGM offered her 1 million dollars for six films and gave her more creative control. She turned down the money, requesting a more modest wage and a percentage so that the studio could use the funds to increase the quality of her films — hiring the best actors, screenwriters, etc. Lillian made numerous television appearances from the early 1950s into the late 1980s. Her last film role was *The Whales of August* in 1987 at the age of 93. Gish never married nor had children. Lillian Gish died peacefully in her sleep of heart failure on February 27, 1993 at the age of 99.
