

#### Secretary's Report for May







## **BACKYARD TECH TIP**



Timing of the Model "A" engine with a stock distributor is accomplished when the piston of the #1 cylinder is at the top of its compression stroke. This occurs when the timing pin is inserted into the front cover and falls into a recess in the timing gear while the engine is being very slowly rotated. Sometimes the recess is very shallow and it is difficult to determine when the pin drops into the recess. A modification to the end of the pin will make it easier to find this recess and make it easier to check ignition timing.

#### **Evening Gowns**

Silky, clinging fabrics were common in evening gowns, often worn with a fur wrap or coat. Fabrics that were popular included chiffon, silk, crepe de chine, and satin, all cut on the bias to create elegant flowing lines. Metallic lamé came into fashion as well. Evening dresses had hems that very nearly touched the floor and often had small trains in the back. Evening dresses were also very fitted in the waist, slim and fitted through the hips, and eased out mid-thigh or just above the knees, where they flared elegantly to the floor. There were gowns with puffs and ruffle sleeves, and later in the decade high necks and halter styles with plunging backs were in fashion. The backless gown is a signature of 1930s evening wear.

Nearly all modern formal gowns have their stylish roots back to the 1930s. Old Hollywood stars of the Golden Years remain icons for glamour on the runway. This year, many current Hollywood stars chose to wear 1930s inspired gowns on the red carpet. It is a style that is a classic favorite in any decade.

## FLAPPER of the MONTH





This month we feature Corinne Griffith. Griffith was born in 1894 and appeared in the first of her sixty films at the age of 22 in 1916. She was the executive producer of eleven of her films. She was known as "The Orchid Lady." Unlike many other silent stars, she did not fade into obscurity in taking smaller and smaller roles. She was also not crushed by the advent of sound. She starred in her last film in 1932, and then decorously retired. She invested her money in real estate and became very wealthy. Corinne authored 11 books published between 1947-73. Griffith was not fond of the film version of her best-selling memoir, 'Papa's Delicate Condition'. She unsuccessfully campaigned for Fred Astaire to play the father and was disappointed with the choice of Jackie Gleason. At the time of her death in 1979, she was not only the richest woman in America, but was also one of the most prominent forces in Republican politics in the state of California.
