
Hello Everyone!




East Side Tune-Up Day



BACKYARD TECH TIP



SPARE CONDENSER

A tip for an emergency condenser is to buy a good condenser that has a "foot" on it and a "pig tail" about 3" long. Loosen up one of the screws that hold the coil to the firewall, slip the "foot" of the condenser between the coil bracket and firewall and then tighten the screw down again making sure there is good contact between all units. This gives a good ground connection. Leave the "pig tail" hang free for emergency use. Should your condenser located in the "A" distributor burn out,



just loosen the coil terminal nut, attach the "pig tail" clip, tighten terminal nut again and be merrily on your way. If you should wish to use this modification, the condenser will serve for years as it is located away from intense heat of the motor. Heat is the worst enemy of the stock Model "A" Ford condenser.

Knickerbockers:

Amy Johnson was a pioneering English pilot who was the first woman to fly solo from London to Australia. She borrowed the knickerbockers, or jodhpurs trouser fashion, from men as a comfortable and practical form of dress for female aviators of the era. The avant-garde style of knickerbockers, loose-fitting breeches gathered at the knee, was adopted as a fashion statement by women during the 1920's, often accompanied by a shirt and tie.

This month we feature Vilma Bánky. Bánky was born in 1901 in Austria-Hungary. After graduation from secondary school, she took courses to work as a stenographer, but was offered a role in a film. Her first film appearance was in Germany in 1919. On a trip to Budapest in 1925, Hollywood film producer Samuel Goldwyn discovered and signed her to a contract. She appeared opposite silent film star Rudolph Valentino in 1925 and 1926. In the mid and late 1920s, she was Goldwyn's biggest money maker. She married actor Rod La Rocque in 1927. It is commonly believed that her thick Hungarian accent led, with the advent of sound, to her career being cut short; however, she began losing interest in films and wanted to settle down with La Rocque and simply be his wife. By 1928, she had begun announcing her intention to retire within a few years. Although the couple never had any children themselves, together they formed the Banky–La Rocque Foundation to educate children. Bánky and La Rocque remained married until his death in 1969. Bánky died in 1991 in Los Angeles, California from cardiopulmonary failure at the age of 90. When she died, she left a sizable estate.
