




BACKYARD TECH TIP

It is not necessary to add lead to the gas or use hitest gas. This is a low compression (4.2:1) low hp (40 hp) engine without hardened valve seats and weak by today's standard valve springs. At an engine rebuild, hardened seats can be added if desired or warranted by valve seat wear.

"A" Word on Fashion

After the shock of the First World War, the collective humanity in Europe and the Americas ushered in the 1920s with much abandon, seeking more fun and freedom. This was reflected in the 20s styles which are aptly captured by the quintessential lively young lady in a knee-length flapper, pump shoes and a cloche hat. Also known as the Roaring 20s or the Jazz Age, it is a decade that saw monumental changes in culture and fashion. Women had achieved a greater degree of freedom as they had been forced to take over many roles when men were off to the war. Ankle-length dresses and restrictive corsets were dumped for looser fitting garments which showed more skin. For men, it was a decade of self-recovery, as many tried to find their footing again after the war. FLAPPER of the MONTH







This month we feature Norma Talmadge. Norma was born in 1895 in Jersey City. She was the daughter of an unemployed alcoholic and his wife. Her father left the family on Christmas Day. Her mother took in laundry to help make ends meet. By the time Norma was 14 she took up modeling. She was successful enough that she attracted the attention of studio chiefs in New York City. She appeared in her first film in 1910. By 1913, she was Vitagraph's most promising young actress. In 1915, Norma and her mother left for California. Over the following eight months, Norma made seven feature films and a few shorts. After her contract ran out, the family returned to the East Coast. In 1916 she met and married producer and businessman Joseph Schenck. With his backing, they formed their own production company and turned out a number of successful films. In 1920, the production company moved to Hollywood. In 1923, Norma was making \$10,000 a week. By 1928, Norma's popularity had begun to fade. Norma's voice did not lend itself to "talkies" and she was out of work. She divorced Schenck and remarried, but her career was over. Between Schenck and her mother's watchful eye, Norma amassed a huge fortune and never wanted for money. After suffering a series of strokes in 1957, Norma died of pneumonia on Christmas Eve of that year. At the time of her death, her estate was valued at more than one million dollars.
