



BACKYARD TECH TIP



DO YOU USE & THERMOSTAT?


Do use a 160* thermostat in your Model "A"? If you don't, the engine heats unevenly, which means it wears unevenly. The purpose of the thermostat is to quickly get the engine to its optimum operating temperature and keep it there. A cool-running engine does not heat the oil sufficiently and you will get sludge build-up in the pan as a result. Further, water will remain in the oil because the oil never gets hot enough to evaporate the water; that creates acids in the oil leading to bearing corrosion. The Model "A" did not come from the factory with a thermostat, but Henry added one to the V-8 in 1933 or 34.



"A" Word on Fashion

Did Women Wear Pants in the 1920s? Yes! Sort of.... (part 3)

Women wore knickers for other sports, besides golf, like hiking, riding, and hunting. They were comfortable, sporty, and fit right in with the "boyish" style of the youth culture. Young women wore them on weekends even while not playing sports. Women stagehands working in Hollywood were also wearing knickers as part of their work attire. Adventure-seeking women on vacation in far off places such as Egypt, Africa, and Australia's outback found wearing knickers much more suitable for exploring the rugged terrain.

This month we feature Leatrice Joy. Joy was born in New Orleans in 1893. She was hired as an actress in 1915. Her mother disapproved of her becoming an actress, but the family needed the money, so her mother accompanied her to California, where she began working in plays and films. Between 1916 and 1917, she was the star of about 20 one-reel comedies. Signed under contract with Samuel Goldwyn Studios, her first role for the studio was in 1917. Her career quickly gained momentum, and by 1920 she had become a highly-popular actress and was given leading-lady status. Her close-cropped hair and boyish persona became fashionable during the era. Cecil B. DeMille signed her to Paramount Pictures in 1922. In 1925, against the advice of studio executives, Joy parted ways with Paramount and followed DeMille to his new film company. After Joy impulsively cut her hair extremely short in 1926, DeMille was publicly angry as it prevented her from portraying traditional feminine roles. Although she regrew her hair after styles changed in early 1927, a professional dispute ended the DeMille/Joy partnership in 1928, and she was signed with MGM. Joy's career began to falter with the advent of talkies. By the early 1930s, Joy was semi-retired. On May 13, 1985, Joy died from acute anemia in Bronx, New York.
