

Model "A" Youth News!

The MARC Adirondack A's Region out of Scotia, New York has a wonderful youth program that could be used as an example for every Model "A" club in the country. The Adirondack A's Youth Program was started in 2009 with the complete restoration of a Model "A" Ford Huckster. Several 13-16 year old youths, under the supervision of club mentors, worked together several Saturdays over the winter disassembling the truck, rebuilding the engine, transmission, rear end, brakes and other components. The cab, frame, fenders, and other body components were stripped of paint, repaired, rebuilt, and repainted. The Huckster is now used by the Adirondack A's as a support vehicle for club events and tours. It is also used to attract new candidates for future restorations.





BACKYARD TECH TIP

IS YOUR FUEL LINE S&FE?

Model "A"s originally came with a one piece steel fuel line from the glass sediment bulb to the carburetor. This one piece steel fuel line provides safety & durability. Over the years, some Model "A" owners have replaced the original steel line with copper tubing. Copper tubing should never be used for a fuel line in a Model "A". Over time, copper tubing will become brittle and engine vibration will cause it to crack and fracture. Cutting the steel line and inserting a rubber hose should never be done as well due to the proximity of the fuel line to the manifold. Heat from the manifold could easily melt the rubber line. In this case, Henry got it right. Stick with the proven winner.

****A** Word on Fashion**


"BLOOMER" KNICKERS

Schoolgirls wore bloomers, a softer form of knickers, in school as well as part of their gym uniform. Black or navy boomers with a Middy top had already been in fashion for girls for a decade or more. It stayed on trend into the 1930s.

One woman as a schoolgirl in the mid-1920s recalls, "The girls all wore middy blouses rolled up at the sides and pinned to look more in style. We also wore sateen



bloomers in blue, red, green or purple, they were tightly fitted below the knees with an elastic cuff. Oftentimes on hot afternoons in our country school, one girl would snap an elastic cuff, then another girl would snap hers. Pretty soon, the snap-snap-snapping sounds were coming from every desk!" vintagedancer.com



This month we feature Carol Dempster. Carol was born in Minnesota in 1901. She was discovered by director D.W. Griffith. Griffith gave Dempster her first role in1916 and he continued to cast her in nearly every one of his films throughout the 1920's. He provided her with professional acting and dancing lessons, grooming her to become his leading star from 1918-26. She had a lengthy relationship with Griffith while he was estranged from his wife. The other actresses in Griffith's stock company, particularly Lillian Gish, Dorothy Gish, Miriam Cooper and Mae Marsh, detested her because she mimicked their acting styles rather than developing a style of her own. This resentment grew when Griffith, who had become obsessed with Dempster, turned away from his stock actresses because he thought he now had a little bit of all of them wrapped up in one package. In 1926, Dempster acted in her final film. Dempster then retired from the screen to marry wealthy banker Edwin S. Larson. Dempster died in La Jolla, California, in 1991 at the age of 89 from heart failure.
