

Dan Bickley had sent an email to everyone with the details. The location is 2555 Harrison Road, Columbus. We will meet at 10:15 a.m. in the brewery parking lot. The tour will start at 10:30 a.m. It will last about an hour. After the tour, we will have lunch at the Brewery Tap Room. If you plan on attending, please let Dan know by February 4th so he can give the brewery a head count.

Vice President Jim Jones said that he is still working on a place for our Christmas Party for 2023.

Treasurer Cheek talked about the MARC National Tour that is being planned in May of 2024. 


The original building was built in 1908. The building was renovated and currently features a 1930s art deco design and features a Mayan themed marquee.










BACKYARD TECH TIP



GAS INTO THE CYLINDERS?



Removing the spark plugs and putting gasoline directly into the cylinders isn't a good idea. All that accomplishes is washing the oil off of the cylinder walls thereby reducing compression. While the gas will probably evaporate before you can get the plugs reinstalled, if it doesn't, raw gasoline will foul the plugs. Spark plugs are supposed to be dry; if they are wet, you have flooded the engine and fouled the plugs. If you have reason to believe that fuel is not getting to the cylinders, use starting fluid. No, starting fluid used correctly and sparingly will not blow up your low horse power, low compression gasoline engine.

"A" Word on Fashion

Fashion in the 1920s was all about the whole look and there were trends in how the body itself was fashioned. The simple lines and androgynous shapes of fashion looked best on bodies free from curves. Through exercise, diet, and various shaping undergarments, women attempted to achieve this look. The sporting look also helped facilitate a mode for suntanned skin. Many women cut their hair into a bob, a popular hairstyle that emerged early in the decade. Hairstyles kept getting shorter first with the shingle and then with the Eton crop, but like hemlines, as the decade drew to a close, women were starting to grow their hair longer again. The cloche hat became an extremely popular accessory that looked best with these short hairstyles.

FLAPPER of the MONTH







This month we feature Mae Marsh. Mae was born in 1894 in Madrid, New Mexico Territory. She worked as a salesgirl and loitered around the sets and locations while her older sister worked on a film. She first started as an extra and played her first substantial role in 1910. Marsh worked for Mack Sennett and D. W. Griffith in small roles at Biograph when they were filming in California. Her big break came in1912 when Mary Pickford refused to play a bare-legged, grass-skirted role. Griffith said if Pickford would not play that part, she would not play the title role in his next film either. Mae jumped at the chance to play the parts. Mae was a prolific actress, sometimes appearing in eight movies per year. In 1916, Samuel Goldwyn signed her to a contract at \$2500 per week - far exceeding the \$35 per week she got in 1915. Other than the publicity, her film career with Goldwyn was a disappointment and she retired on the eve of her marriage in 1918. She married Goldwyn's publicity agent and they had three children together. They were married until her death in 1968.
