

Menswear

Another development in menswear in the twenties was the plus-fours. Plus-fours developed out of ordinary knickers, short-legged trousers that gather around the knee. Like Oxford bags, they were a bit baggier version of their precursor. They had four extra inches of material, hence the name. But instead of extending the trouser leg, they still fastened around the knee and the extra material hung over the band, creating the baggy look as seen at a racecourse in 1920. Often worn with a sweater, plus-fours were a popular golf attire. Much like how tennis-wear crept into casual womenswear, this style was also popular daywear for men, as was tennis-wear for men, too. You can see the casual way men dressed to play tennis, though some still wore ties in 1920's.







BACKYARD TECH TIP



EXHAUST LEAK?

If you have an exhaust leak and find the block is badly pitted, usually around #4 cylinder exhaust port, you will have leak problems. One way to fix the problem is to use hi-temp metal epoxy. VersaChem's exhaust manifold repair or ThermoSteel are said to be good to 2000 degrees. First, remove the manifold and clean the area with brake cleaner. Then put a little epoxy on it, cover it with some wax paper, and then bolt the manifold back on. After it dries, take the manifold off and use a die grinder to clean the

epoxy that might have squished into the port. Finally, install a new gasket and bolt the manifold back on again. Many folks use Permatex hi-temp copper sealer on their exhaust gaskets. This method should take care of any leaks that you may have.






It's Time To Vote!

FLAPPER of the MONTH







This month we feature Jetta Goudal. She was born Juliette Goudeket in1891 in the Netherlands. The daughter of a Jewish orthodox diamond cutter, she began her career on stage in Europe. Arriving in New York City in 1918, she purposely disguised her ancestry and her age, passing herself off as "Jetta Goudal," a Parisienne born in Versailles in 1901 and the daughter of a lawyer. She first appeared on Broadway in 1921. She attracted immediate attention with her first two small film roles and caught the eye of legendary director Cecil B. DeMille. Unfortunately, the element of mystery that made Goudal so popular on-screen came with a price. She was an unrepentant theatrical "grand dame" and possessed a fierce temper. Her extreme difficulty on the set led to DeMille breaking her contract, which in turn led Goudal to file a landmark lawsuit against him. Goudal won the lawsuit, but the damage to her career and reputation never recovered. Moreover, with the arrival of sound, her very thick French accent left her with limited offers. Goudal married in 1930 and retired from the screen permanently three years later. Plagued by health problems, she suffered a serious fall in 1973 which left her an invalid. She died in 1985. Her devoted husband was interred next to her upon his death in 1993.
