Harbor Area Model "A" Club

About a year ago, Weeg Thompson suggested we reach out to the Southern California Regional Occupational Center to see if we could bring our cars and do a presentation for Model "A" Youth month (a first for our club). Here is what developed as a result of her wonderful suggestion and the efforts of Pat Harrison, who was able to make a connection through two of their Board Members.

Several of our club members hopped in their cars on May 4th for the short trip to the Southern California Regional Occupational Center in Torrance in recognition of Model "A" Youth month where we were greeted by 24 students, the automotive class instructor Alan Lee, and the superintendent of SoCal ROC, Dr. Atlas Helaire.

Our program started with an introduction of who we are, why we were there, information about the Model "A" Youth Restoration Award and our club, and an invitation to come to our meetings.

President Rob Hernandez shared a brief history about the Model "A". Tool Coordinator, Bobby DeCrescenzo, talked about Henry Ford, how he got started and some of his inventions. He brought several Model "A" tools, asked students if they knew their purpose, and then explained how they were used.

We had ten Model "A"s, from the working man's models to the luxury models. Students moved from car to car with our members sharing information about their cars such as type and year, when and how they were acquired, what they had done mechanically and cosmetically, an interesting story, etc.

We then reconvened for questions and to raffle off three of our club hats. Each student received a laser engraved wooden business card with the club logo, website address, and QR code that would take students directly to our website (they were a huge hit—everyone wanted one!). Torrance CitiCable was there to film the event. All members should be able to view it on YouTube.

MODEL "A" BRAKES

Once you get your Model "A" running, your next project is likely to be getting it to stop. Don't be deceived by the ease of brake adjusting wedges or believing that all of your problems will go away by relining the brakes. Or, worse yet, believing the old myth that "The brakes never worked in Model A's". Simply put, the reason for most Model "A" brake problems is the number of unlubricated wear points throughout the entire system. The slightest wear or out of adjustment fitting in all of those wear points quickly adds up. If you have 1/32" of wear at 8



places, that adds up to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". At some point, your wedges and rods can no longer be adjusted to account for wear. When you have brake problems, start at the pedal and check every single component all the way to the drum.

"A" Word on Fashion

Like womenswear, menswear saw a shift of focus to the movies for fashion inspiration in the 1930s. Just as women's fashion had begun to democratize in the twenties, men's fashion followed suit. Fashion writer Colin McDowell writes of the power movies had over men's fashion in the thirties, recalling that sales of undershirts slumped when Clark Gable revealed that he wasn't wearing one in 1934's It Happened One Night. Here, we see the shift of influence from the elite, such as the Duke of Windsor, to working-class heroes of the movies. McDowell continues, "The



images of the cinema broke a pattern of fashion which had prevailed for centuries, giving birth to the blue-collar style leader. With rare exceptions, all previous fashion had been created by a social elite whose greatest claims were exclusivity and wealth. Now, fashion was to percolate up through the classes, instead of down."

Passenger Bus Project

I have been bringing you articles from the Model "A" Ford Foundation, Inc. (MAFFI) about the restoration of their Passenger Bus project that they started in May of 2019. This is the fifth and final installment of the series. If you have been following along, you know their goal was to have the bus completed and unveil it at this year's Model "A" Days in Hickory Corners, Michigan in September. I am pleased to report that they achieved their goal!

Over the past couple years, many of the small parts were scattered across the country with volunteers donating their time and talents restoring them back to their original condition. Once all of those parts were gathered back up, it was time to start the tedious task of assembly. Many of the parts, large and small, were painted prior to assembly. Once assembled, touch-ups were required to make the bus pristine. This was a huge project that everyone who helped with can be very proud of. Ken Ehrenhofer donated the bus to the Model "A" Ford Foundation. They will loan it to the Gilmore Museum, not to be displayed, but to serve as a working bus to give rides to the museum visitors. Once unveiled, the bus was put into service and the bus rides began. If you ever visit the Gilmore Museum, be sure to take a ride on the Ford bus!

FLAPPER of the MONTH







This month we feature May McAvoy. May was born in New York City in 1899. Her well-to-do family owned and operated a large livery stable situated where the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel now stands. May was a model whose first job was a commercial for Domino Sugar. She appeared in her first film as an extra in 1917. May was the queen of the Rose Bowl Parade in 1923. After appearing in more than three dozen films, she co-starred in the 1925 production of Ben-Hur. In 1927, May appeared in Hollywood's first talkie, The Jazz Singer, with Al Jolson. May coached Jolson as he made his film debut. May also starred in England's first all-talking picture in 1928. In 1929, she married the treasurer of United Artist, Maurice Cleary. For years, a rumor circulated that May retired from the screen at the transition to sound films because of a speech impediment. In truth, Cleary asked her not to work. They divorced in 1940 and May returned to film, playing small, uncredited roles throughout the 1940s and 1950s. Her final film appearance was a small part in the 1959 version of Ben-Hur. She remarried Cleary in 1971. In 1984, May died from the after effects of a heart attack from the previous year. She was 84 years old.
