




25TH ANNIVERSARY



One point if you recruit a new member.


Once you reach 16 points, you are entitled to a free membership! That's it!

BACKYARD TECH TIP



SETTING THE GAS ADJUSTING VALVE

The Gas Adjusting Valve (GAV) provides a manual adjustment for additional gasoline to the Cap Jet, bypassing the metering effect of the Compensator Jet. The carburetor was designed slightly lean to allow for high altitude driving and, with the GAV, is able to provide additional fuel as needed. This extra fuel is normally needed when the vehicle is cold and at low engine speeds.

With the engine stopped, turn the choke rod clockwise until it stops. You will notice where the little raised marker is pointing. Then turn it counter-clockwise about one turn if the engine is cold, for startup. Turn it only a half of a turn if the engine is warm. After a few minutes running, try turning it clockwise, then counter-clockwise, until the engine runs smoothly and the engine revs without faltering.

Each carburetor has different amounts of wear, so experiment a little at a time so that your Model "A" runs and performs at its best. Some will even run closed when hot! You should have it somewhere between closed (clockwise) and one turn open under normal driving conditions.

This month I thought I'd share a bit of the history to be found in the museum at Hickory Corners, where the very first Model "A" is housed, and to whet your appetite to visit and see all the history found there along with the completed museum expansion. Model "A" Days are September 18 - 20, 2025. Join us!!

A Few Facts About the First Model "A"

Serial Number: 1

Body Style: 1928 Ford Model "A" Tudor changed to a Phaeton

Motor: 4 Cylinder, 201 CID, 40 HP

Brakes: Mechanical

Transmission: 3-Speed Manual, Non-Synchronized

Body: Ford Motor Company Maximum Passengers: 5

Electric: 6-Volt Battery w/positive ground

Tire Size: 450-21

Fuel Capacity: 10 Gallons Weight: 2,212 pounds

Cost: Free (Gift to Thomas Edison)

This car was the first 1928 Ford Model "A" produced. It was assembled on October 20, 1927 and given to Henry Ford's best friend Thomas Edison. It was originally a Tudor Sedan, but Edison preferred an open car. Ford had the Tudor body replaced with a Phaeton body. Outside door handles were not produced for the early Model "A" cars. With the existing changes to the car, a restoration process was never attempted. Photos of Ford stamping number "1" on the engine are available. Ford told Edison that his name would always be with the Ford name and in the logo for Ford since the cross in the letter "F" forms a letter "T" in the distance. The swirl on the end of the cross forms the top of the letter "E" with the letter "O" forming the bottom of the letter "E".

FLAPPER of the MONTH







This month we feature Fay Wray. Wray was born in 1907 in Canada. Her family moved to Salt Lake City a couple years later and eventually relocated in Hollywood. Wray appeared in her first film at the age of 16, when she landed a role in a short historical film sponsored by a local newspaper. In 1925, she appeared in her second film and also in uncredited bit parts at the Hal Roach Studios. She then signed with Universal Studios, mostly co-starring in low-budget westerns. The following year she signed with Paramount Pictures, where she was cast in her first lead role. Wray stayed with Paramount to make more than a dozen films and made the transition from silent films to "talkies". After leaving Paramount, Wray signed with other film studios. Under those deals, Wray was cast in several horror films, including her best-remembered film, King Kong. The film was a commercial success and Wray was reportedly proud that it saved RKO from bankruptcy. After "Kong", she began a slow decline that put her into low-budget action films. In 1939, her 11-year marriage ended in divorce, and her career was almost finished. In 1942 she remarried and retired from the screen. She remained married until her husbands death in 1955. She married a third time in 1971, until his death twenty years later. Wray died in her sleep of natural causes in 2004.
