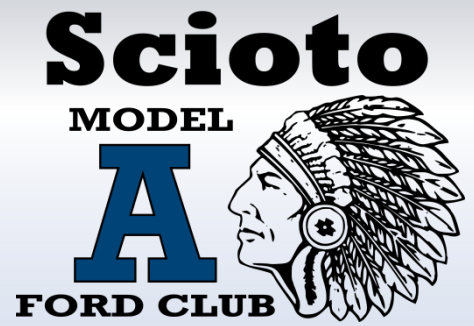

## **Pop-Up Tour Added to Schedule on July 14<sup>th</sup> !**

This summer, the Union Pacific's famed Big Boy No. 4014 will make a run to the East Coast for the first time as part of a historic coast-to-coast tour to celebrate America's 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary. This tour includes a stop in Fostoria, Ohio on Tuesday, July 14<sup>th</sup>, where the Big Boy will be on display from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Of the eight remaining Big Boys in existence today, No. 4014 is the only one still in operation. The Big Boys are 133 feet long and weigh 1.2 million pounds, making them the largest steam engines in the world.

The Scioto Model "A" Ford Club will be making the trip up to Fostoria, Ohio to take advantage of the opportunity to see this massive steam engine while it is passing through our state. Our Treasurer, Jaci Rohner, attended the meeting and provided a brief financial update.

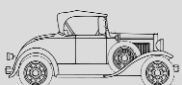

## "A" Word on Fashion

### **What Shoes Did Men Wear in the 1920s?** (part II)

Last month we discussed the popularity of the Oxford shoe during the '20s. Another popular shoe style for men in the 1920s was the brogue. Brogues were characterized by their decorative perforations or "broguing" on the leather upper. These perforations not only added a touch of elegance but also served a practical purpose by allowing water to drain out of the shoe. Brogues were often worn with tweed suits or casual attire, giving men a stylish and rugged appearance. They were available in different colors and styles, including wingtip and longwing brogues.

For those looking for a more casual and comfortable option, the loafer was a popular choice. Loafers were slip-on shoes that did not require laces or buckles. They were typically made of leather or suede and had a low heel. Loafers were perfect for leisure activities and were often worn with casual outfits such as knickerbockers or golf attire. They provided men with a relaxed and effortless style, making them a favorite among the younger generation.

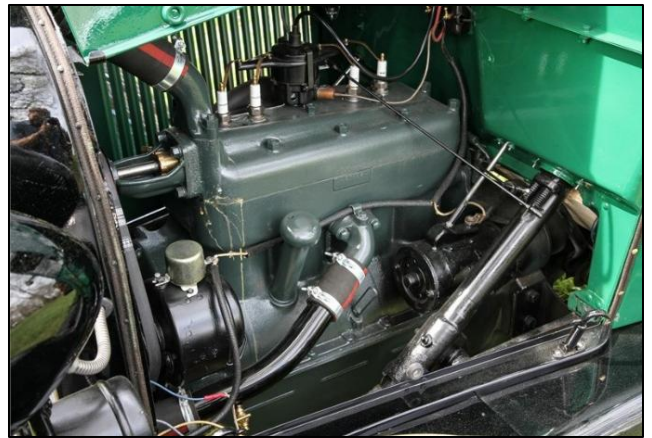

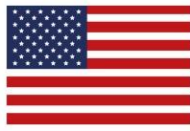

# MEMORIAL DAY PARADE

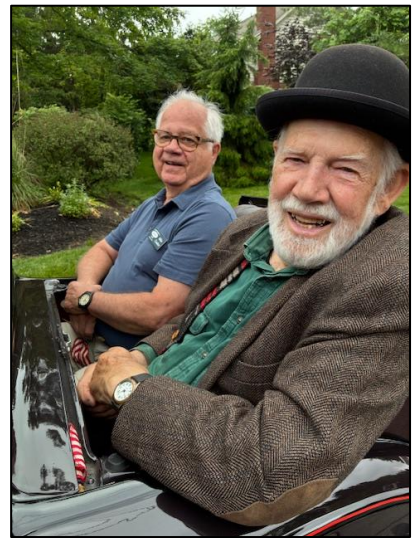

# BACKYARD TECH TIP



## COOLANTS – WHAT DO YOU USE?

At the time the Model “A” was manufactured, water with maybe some soluble oil was the coolant in common use. Water has excellent heat transfer characteristics; however corrosion products (particularly with ferrous metals) is a problem.

Over the years manufacturers have developed specialized coolants with various additives for the vehicle engine/radiator cooling system. There are two types of coolants:

**Type A:** Coolants with inhibitors, anti-freeze, anti-boil additives based on water and glycol.

**Type B:** Coolants that have no anti-freeze or anti-boil performance and are essentially inhibitors only.

Most of us use a “Type A” coolant. More recently the formulations of the coolants have changed to take into account the amount of aluminum or similar alloys used in modern vehicles. One of the additives is identified as OAT (Organic Acid Technology) which works well in late model cars. However, this product may not be suitable for older cars, say greater than 10 years old. In vehicles such as our Model “A”s, these new additives may attack the gaskets and gasket cements. Also, it has been found that the acid coolant may destroy soldered joints in the older type radiators.

The solution for our older cars is to use a product with IAT (inorganic acid technology) if using a “Type A” coolant. Some manufacturers supply a coolant for older vehicles. Examples of these include Peak Green, Zerex Original Green, Ultra Cool Green, and Prestone Prime Conventional Green. Most of these come in your choice of a pre-mix formula or a concentrated formula. If you purchase the pre-mix formula, it is ready to use straight out of the jug. If you purchase the concentrated formula, water must be added before putting it into your radiator. If you have to add water, you should always use distilled water instead of tap water. The main performance characteristic of these products is as a coolant and inhibitor to prevent corrosion. The high percentage of water ensures maximum heat transfer.





## PIATT CASTLE MAC-A-CHEEK TOUR

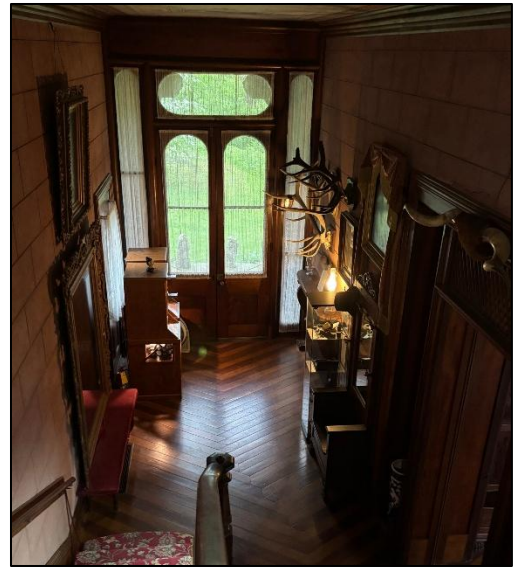

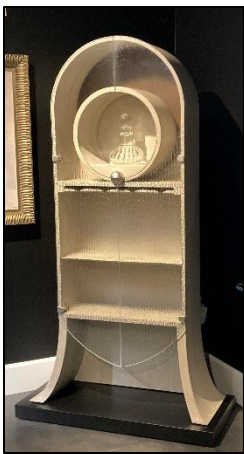

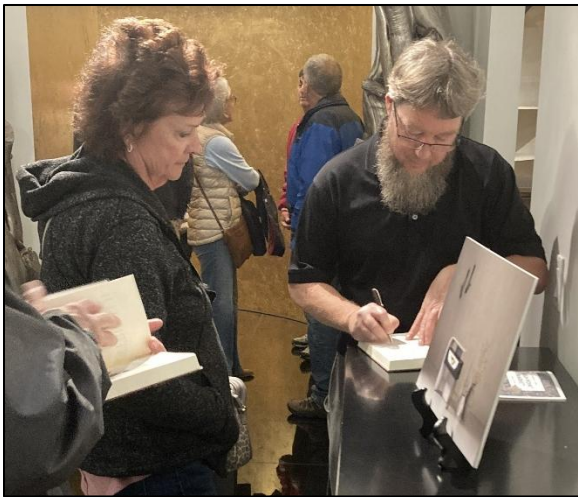

This month we feature Marguerite Clark. Clark was born in Avondale, Ohio in 1883. Her mother passed away when she was 10 and her father when she was 13. Her sister became her guardian. She removed Clark from public school and sent her to a convent in Blue Ash, Ohio. Clark finished school at the age of 16 and decided to pursue a career in theatre. She made her first stage appearance in 1899 in Baltimore and appeared on Broadway the following year. For over a decade she appeared in some of the most popular plays and musicals on Broadway. In 1914 she signed with Famous Players, which would produce all but her last movie. Clark quickly became one of the top movie stars of the time. However, she was dissatisfied with the acting life. In 1918 she married a New Orleans plantation owner. She split her time between New York and New Orleans, all the time planning to quit acting and move permanently to the plantation. Clark was ranked as the top movie actress of 1920. She starred in her final movie in 1921 and immediately retired. Clark had appeared in 40 films in just 7 years. At the time of her retirement, she was the top actress on the silver screen. Once retired, she stayed on her husband's plantation, where she lived until his death in 1936. Shortly thereafter, she moved back to New York and lived with her sister. Clark died of pneumonia in 1940 at the age of 57.
